Tues. Mar 2, 1847: "Was home until one o'clock and then went with my wife to the council house to our police party.

It was an uncommonly beautiful, clear, warm and pleasant day. We had the Police, the Twelve and Band present, and enjoyed ourselves uncommonly well by dancing, talking, eating sweet cakes &c and some little preaching... Took wife home 11 p.m. Party quit 3 a.m." One of the things
